May Fair planning is underway, and we still have a few spots left to be filled. Here is a bit of information on the vacant roles:

Coordinators:

<u>Toy/Book Table:</u> Coordination! The book and toy table is a favourite amongst kids and adults alike at the event. To prepare the book/toy table the coordinator needs to place a bin in the school to collect books and toys from parents. The books and toys are then priced and sold at the event.

<u>Junior Games</u>: Creative minds needed! Kids are smart! Let's find ways to make them have fun with creative games for them to participate in with friends. This role will make sure we have the volunteers and materials needed for the games.

<u>Munchkin Games</u>: Imagination! Prepare games for little ones to keep them busy. Ensure volunteers, and required materials are available.

<u>Parade</u>: The parade starts the May Fair! This person will need to contact RCMP, Fire Station, RCMP Horses, gather bike decoration and ensure we are set up for a walk around the block with the childrens' decorated bikes.
