### Impact of Eastern Secondary Review on Manor Park Area

Currently Manor Park high school students in the public school board's English program are directed to Rideau HS. Students wishing to take Extended French or French Immersion at the high school level have the option to attend Gloucester HS or the closest of the following schools to the student's residence: Colonel By S.S., Glebe C.I., Hillcrest H.S. or Lisgar C.I. These directions will change for September 2017. If Rideau HS remains open, it will be the designated school for Extended French and French Immersion as well as for English. If Rideau HS is closed, then Gloucester HS will be the Manor Park area designated school for English, Extended French and French Immersion.

First public meeting on this issue is Nov. 1, 7-9pm Rideau HS Trustee Zone meeting Sat. Nov. 12, 9-11am at Rideau HS.
