- Shari has asked for buzzer system to be delayed for time being. Will install door swipes on all outside doors before Sept.
- Shari notes that according to EQAO, boys are not performing as well as girls MP will create plan to help for example, buying non-fiction books

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- there will be a 'pay it forward' assembly April 25th
- dance workshops coming
- leadership team is fundraising for education week
- yearbook is going in to print
- dance troupe is coming back teacher is running it
- track and field being planned some grade 6 kids are helping out coaching younger kids

labour relations

- ▲ no teachers present at this meeting due to conflict with workshop
- ▲ extra curricular activities are returning
- ▲ teachers are helping with May Fair
- ▲ more field trips being booked
- however, still no clarity on whether ALL activities will return at this point, teachers are not collecting and counting forms or money
