Welcome:

Meeting called to order at 7:01pm by Marie Blythe-Hallman, chair.

Minutes from November meeting discussed. Comments were made about the parent resource lending library. Susan Steele agreed to provide more details about the funding as the current information is a little misleading. Minutes were approved with these observations added.

It was suggested that forms for (such as for volunteering and pizza, etc.) be posted on the website.

Several people offered praise to Nancy Grinberg for the choir which performed this day. It was a very successful concert.

Principal's Report:

- holiday concert finally took place today choir was amazing, parents helped out
- parent volunteers are stepping up to take on new tasks choir, badminton, etc. all have met board requirements (applied, interviewed, checked, etc). Shari will send out info about further training Jan 31st, March 5th 1st requirement is police record check, contact Shari if you want to get process started cost is \$51, but there is a \$15 discount with a letter from Shari the whole process is free if you're willing to wait (about 8-9 weeks) need letter for that as well.
- There is talk of having a volleyball team
- If we can find a parent volunteer, we might be able to keep the leadership team going

Security

Shari has been consulting with Bill Tyres – examining how to improve security. Not much is going to happen right away. They are looking at a new buzzer system and security cameras in office. Right now all doors are locked. Three outside doors use swipe system. Bill will provide more swipe doors for free, including the front door. It will be a hassle for

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volunteers who come and go so we are looking for advice on how to handle days like today when school is open for events. Apparently a letter was sent out to parents (several said that they hadn't seen the letter) reminding people that visitors need to wear visible name tags and need to sign in, etc. School is asking that parents not accompany children to office when they are late. This will reduce traffic in school and encourage independence. Also parents should drop items off at school rather than go to classroom Snow days are especially tough – lots of unfamiliar adults in school Sign in and sign out important to know who is in school in case of emergency Emphasis on being on time

Asked how school council can help? Suggested that we add reminders on our website. Being on time is a life skill that our students will benefit from learning.

Shari has a question for parents at Manor Park – if there is a subject or an issue that parents want to discuss, please mention it to Shari. She is willing to look into getting someone in to speak on a subject, possible guest speaker, could have members of community come in.

Also, 3 or 4 students have been accepted into a program that will allow them to go to Tim Horton's camp in NS for March break.

Fundraising for Phoebe Rose

Her big sister is in Donna's class. Phoebe Rose suffers from a very rare cancer, treatment (and related costs) can be very expensive – she may be going for treatment in Philadelphia. The school has already raised close to \$3000. Question was asked about field trips – we don't want one class to get trips and other classes to miss out.
