Welcome:

Meeting called to order at 7:03pm by Marie Blythe-Hallman. Since we do not have quorum yet, approval of minutes from January meeting is delayed

Principal's Report:

- Shari Brodie reported on a new program for boys that is run by Big Brothers, Big Sisters; MP has two mentors (they are security recruits who are seeking to become policemen), the program is about working with small groups of boys, working on relationships, etc.
- there is also a program for girls called "Go Girls" (mentioned in an earlier meeting)
- MP also offers also piano lessons, which uses keyboards, called "heart of the city", MP has a volunteer teacher
- there will be a volleyball tournament date not yet set, but likely end of March or beginning of April, Brenda Grier now coaching boys and girls,
- MP also has a volunteer who is teaching basketball skills
- gym is very full, lots of activities, yoga, choir, sports, etc.

Vice-principal Laura Frappier spoke Peace tree project

- A Students working on peace tree project asking students from a variety of countries what are varied messages of peace? Each class is learning about different peace symbols, there will be announcements on PA, letters will be sent home asking parents to write 'peace' in home language
- Maha's grade 6 class has improved upon original idea

Safe School Initiative

▲ another initiative is related to Bill 13 which requires schools to form a group that focuses on safe school – discuss making MP safe and inclusive – members include Susan Steele, Maha Albari, Jen Coulas, a student from grade 6, (looking

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for a boy to make it representative); group intends to focus on mental health, talking to Ontario public health and other groups, looking at ways to educate staff

♠ premier's award for 'accepting' schools – a student and parent have written letters to nominate MP – results will be known later

Shari spoke about 'pink day' last Thursday

- some students gave presentations, now available on youtube (search for 'True Colours')
- 'pay it forward' charity wants to come to school to give out bracelets, idea is to do a good deed, pass on the bracelet

Maha spoke about new technology bought with council money (see minutes from earlier meetings)

- ♠ 6 multi-media carts, teachers have received training on how to use new technology
- still waiting for projectors to be installed in classrooms upstairs (in 'new' wing)
- teachers says that they appreciate the technology

Labour relations

- not all extras run by teachers, still plenty being done, parents have stepped up with sports and clubs
- A many teachers want to resume extras, communication needed with union
- activities that improve health (esp mental health) are still going on
- △ Shari says that the teachers want to be team members
- Maha says that the teachers appreciate the parents' support
- all teachers are covering necessary activities, but they are unhappy at what they have lost – lost money, pensions
- ▲ latest message from Ministry is that the Ministry will talk to the teachers in a nicer way, but there are no new elements being offered
- parents report that some teachers appear less happy, environment is less positive
- school acknowledged that teachers are sad and frustrated

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- ▲ It was pointed out that there are tradeoffs teachers are able to spend more time with their classes, more time to prepare since they are not doing extra curriculum activities
- no timelines offered as to when situation will be reevaluated
- teachers are losing salary, waiting to hear what new govt will do
- refusing to do extras is the only labour action that teachers feel that they can do
- parents are losing patience those who can might be thinking of moving children to different school boards (Note – lots of parents are not wealthy enough to afford private, not Catholic, not French – public school is only option)
- a parent suggested that council might consider stepping away from their policy of neutrality to express an opinion, maybe write a letter to Wynne
- ▲ Suggested that union reps need to take message back to union about parents losing patience
- everyone wants this issue resolved
- decided that council can debate whether we should do something (and if so, what) by email (might not be appropriate in meeting)
- ▲ re communications to kids teachers have been careful about not politicizing issue, much of the info probably comes from home
- school officials not supposed to 'correct' kids on what they know or the opinions they express
- debate council should stay neutral, but individuals can express their opinions
- ♠ info is available on website
- △ school council is reluctant to appear to be taking sides

Susan Steele – resource library

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- received a donation of more books, library remains underused, but parents are starting to learn about it and use it
- link to 'safe schools' encourages parents to discuss mental health
- the whole system is set up to be confidential
- wide variety of subjects autism, aspergers, anxiety, parenting advice, discipline, grieving, crisis in family, adoption, etc.

Shari spoke about safe welcome program

- Ontario govt is offering funds to lock doors, make schools more 'secure', school has received advice on security (see notes from last meeting)
- Shari wants to hear parents' opinion on security,
- swipe doors are coming, right now all doors are locked except front door,
- is this necessary? there have been incidents where people have gained access to school when they should not have – for example, parents without custody tried to take kids, armed man ran through school several years ago.
- Parents asked guestions will system be turned off after school?
- People have propped doors open, will system allow access without compromising security?.
- Question about effectiveness of a camera, buzz-in system (like at de la Salle)
- Parents expressed opinion that this increase in security is unfortunate, but probably inevitable
- MP is already on waiting list to have system installed (but could decline if offered)
- Council agrees that we should ask parents what their opinion is through websites, newsletter, etc.
