Principal's Report: October 16, 2013

Staffing: We were very fortunate to be able to open a new SK-EFI class this week, bringing our numbers from 28-31 students per class, down to 22 per class. Katie Stansfield has been hired as the new full time teacher and will be teaching the English portion of the day. Her class will switch with Leslie Watson's class half way through the day as Leslie will be teaching the French portion of the day to both classes. Casey Atwell, the ECE previously working with Ms. Watson, will now be working with Ms. Stansfield and our new ECE, Melody Poirier, will be working in Ms. Watson's class. We have hired Kerry Maheral who will be working with Tammy Shelswell in JK beginning on October 28th.

We are also pleased to welcome Shirley Cameron who will be joining us as a .25 Core French/Kindergarten teacher. Shirley is a retired teacher who brings with her a wealth of experience teaching Core French.

We still need to hire a 0.67 FTE kindergarten/support teacher.

School Safety Procedures:

- Lock down practice will occur on October 22nd. Letter will be going home tomorrow.

School Wide Behaviour Plan:

Our School Wide Behaviour Plan was reviewed at our October PA Day with the goal of having consistent expectations throughout the school and on the yard. Students are being reminded to be quiet in the hallways, always walk on the right hand side of the hall and to consistently follow our two minute cool down when entering the school.

School Council Liability Insurance:

This year, as part of the District's risk management strategy, the District will be providing and paying for the School Council's liability coverage for the policy period 1 November 2013 to 1 November 2014. The school council \$2 million third party liability insurance coverage will be provided through the Ontario School Boards'

Insurance Exchange (OSBIE) and confirmation of the coverage will be sent to the school council chairs within the next few weeks.

Lunch Time Monitors:

Mme Albari and Dylan (CYW) held training sessions for all of our student lunch monitors. They reviewed expectations, looked at the appropriate steps to follow if there is an issue in the class, and learned several new games that they could play with the Primary students that they help to supervise.
